Highlights from the recent Club Board of Directors Meeting

The Sahuaro Miata Club Board of Directors met at 10:00 a.m. November 7, 2017 at Berge Mazda in Gilbert. Several interested club members also attended as guests.

Treasurer Tony Munro noted the club has a balance of \$3,417.55. A couple weeks prior to the meeting he shared a message that IRS reinstated the club's non-profit status.

Membership Coordinator Nancy Cunningham announced that four new members joined in October, bringing our total to 101 dues paying memberships plus 3 active life members and 8 inactive lifetime members.

Vice President Mark Kucera discussed upcoming club events. Key items included:

- A request from Berge Mazda for us to jointly hold a Miata show. The date is pending.
- Concourse in the Hills. The February 10th event will be a fundraiser for Children's Hospital. Jeff is hoping for a very strong turn-out of our members to this prestigious event.

The Reason of Giving By: Art Kessel

This past September Mark and Cathey Kucera hosted an event that gratified Iris and me in a way both of us can't remember feeling the same in a long time. Sure, we enjoyed past events where we drove in a caravan of Miata's, saw and explored new sights, drove challenging roads and got to socialize with a group of interesting people, all very gratifying. Mark and Cathey showed us through the club, a whole new level of gratification by volunteering ourselves for a good cause. It was a long drive early in the morning from the West Valley to Mesa and we were still yawning when we pulled into the parking lot. A sign in front read Feed My Starving Children assuring us we were finally there. When we walked up to the door and saw how many people were participating; parents with young children, teenagers, young and middle age adults and retirees like us.

Iris and I caught up with Mark, Cathey and Martha Purfeerst inside. Mark, Cathey and Martha had volunteered there before, so we got the short version of what we would do and what is their purpose. Feed My Starving Children is a non-profit organization created in 1987. Volunteers are needed for 2-hour sessions to hand-package life-saving meals for starving children around the world. They are able to take up to 140 people per packing session. The volunteer packed nutritious meals which will be shipped to over 70 countries. The meals are specifically designed to reverse and prevent malnutrition and are dispensed in schools, orphanages, clinics and feeding programs to break the cycle of poverty. What makes the whole experience interesting is they inform you during orientation where the food you're packaging will go.

Mark and I worked in the warehouse bringing out rice, soy and vitamin supplements to the packaging tables. Upbeat music is played during the session and you quickly learn about teamwork. I got such a kick seeing small children standing on boxes working next to adults all immersed in their job and enjoying every minute. How can two hours of labor be gratifying? Believe me it is. Iris and I look forward to next two events at Feed My Starving Children in November and January 6, 2018. Hope we can get more club members involved for a great cause. Mark and Cathey, thanks for bringing us along on the ride.
