

Motorcycle Museum Tour and Lunch

10 Club members enjoyed a very interesting tour of the Buddy Stubb's Harley-Davidson dealership motorcycle museum after having a tasty lunch at Bootlegger's Smokehouse.

After lunch, Mark led the group to Buddy Stubb's Harley-Davidson, where we were privileged to meet Buddy Stubbs. Buddy gave us a tour of his 132 motorcycle collection and told us about his interesting motorcycling industry career. Buddy's grew up in his father's Harley dealership, so it was only natural for Buddy to start his own Harley business, which he has been running for 52 years. He started racing motorcycles as a kid and continued doing so to adulthood. He raced road race and dirt track bikes at a professional level, winning major races, notably the Daytona 100 race. He also worked as a Hollywood stuntman. We saw a picture of Buddy on a motorcycle with Bob Hope riding on the back of Buddy's motorcycle. Buddy was also a personal friend of Evil Kenevil. Buddy's collection includes a replica of the Triumph motorcycle that Evil attempted to jump over the fountains, and crashed, at Caesar's Palace in Las Vegas.

The motorcycle collection has bikes from 10 different counties, and 37 different manufactures. The collection spans the history of Harley-Davidson, and also features rare models from AJS, BMW, BSA, Triumph, Zundapp, Indian, and more. From the earliest examples of street bikes to racing bikes from the 30's, 40's and 50's, the museum's collection is the largest in the Southwest. Along with Harley-Davidson bikes dating as far back as the original 1903 model, the museum also features a large selection of Triumph bikes spanning several decades. All the bikes are in working order today.

We all found Buddy very personable and interesting. He had lots of interesting stories about his collection of motorcycles and his life experiences. Stop by his dealership and museum at 13850 N Cave Creek Rd in Phoenix for a tour of his collection.

This event was hosted by **Mark Kucera** on January 24th. Preceding the tour the group met for lunch at Bootleggers Modern American Smokehouse on Shea Blvd.

Tech Tips



Here's a tech tip for owners of ND Miatas with stick shift that I'll guess many don't know.

If you want to make a quick start from a standing stop in your stick shift ND MX-5, you must disengage the Hill Assist before you launch. You may have noticed your stick shift ND doesn't roll backward for a second or two on a hill when you let off the brakes. That is the Hill Assist holding the brakes on for a moment. If the Hill Assist is engaged, which it will be if you used the brakes to stop the car, the car will stumble away from the start if you rev it up and pop the clutch out because the brakes are on for just a moment. You won't be able to spin the tires or accelerate like you would expect.

The way to quick launch is; once you get your car stopped take your foot off of the brake, put the car into neutral then put it back into first gear without touching the brake pedal. If you are on an incline/decline where the car won't stay in place, use the e-brake to keep yourself staged. Now rev it up and go!

LASTLAUGH

How To Drive In Phoenix:

- 1. You must first learn to pronounce the city name, it is FEE-NICKS. There are other names to learn such as Awatukee (Ah-wa-Too-Kee) but that will be included in the advanced course.
- 2. The morning rush hour is from 5:00 am to noon. The evening rush hour is from noon to 7:00 pm. Friday's rush hour starts on Thursday morning.
- 3. The minimum acceptable speed on most freeways is 85 mph. On Loop 101, your speed is expected to at least match the highway number. Anything less is considered "Wussy".
- 4. Forget the traffic rules you learned elsewhere. Phoenix has its own version of traffic rules. For example: cars/trucks with the loudest muffler go first at a fourway stop; the trucks with the biggest tires go second. However, East Valley, SUV-driving, cell-phone-talking moms ALWAYS have the right of way.
- 5. If you actually stop at a yellow light, you will be rear ended, cussed out, and possibly shot.
- 6. Never honk at anyone. Ever. Seriously. It's another offense that can get you shot.
- 7. Road construction is permanent and continuous in Phoenix. Detour barrels are moved around for your entertainment pleasure during the middle of the night to make the next day's driving a bit more exciting.
- 8. Maricopa Freeway, Papago Freeway and the 'I-10' are the same road. SR202 is the same road as the Red Mountain FWY. Dunlap and Olive are the same street too. Jefferson becomes Washington, but they are not the same street. SR101 is also the Pima FWY except west of I-17, which is also The Black Canyon FWY, and The Veterans Memorial HWY. Lastly, Thunderbird Rd. becomes Cactus Rd. But, Cactus Rd. doesn't become Thunderbird Rd. because it dead ends at a mountain.
- 9. If someone actually has a turn signal on, wave them to the shoulder immediately to let them know it has been accidentally activated.
- 10.If you are in the left lane and only driving 70 in a 55-65 mph zone, you are considered a road hazard and will be "flipped off" accordingly. If you return the flip, you'll be shot.
- 11. For summer driving, it is advisable to wear potholders on your hands.
