

2018 Annual Meeting Awards



WHAT IS THE "MEMBER AT LARGE"?

The title "Immediate Past President" and "Member at Large" are used interchangeably. If the retiring past President is available then he or she fills the role of ""Immediate Past President". If the SMC does not have that past officer to fill the role then someone volunteers for the role. That position when not filled by a past President is called "Member at Large".

By Laws, Article V "officers and duties" read: 5.9 Immediate Past President - The Immediate Past President serves as an advisor to the President and the other Directors on the board.

Annual Meeting Newsletter Feedback

At the December Annual Meeting, the Board offered a survey to attendees regarding our newsletter to help hone and modify this service to our membership. The feedbacks were tallied and analyzed - the result being this first issue of 2019 which you are reading. In general based on the feedbacks, the newsletter will move to an every-other-month publication schedule and focus on those arears the membership appears to most value. Thank you for your participation in the survey!

Below is a high level summary of the information we received:

- There were **62 attendees** at the Annual Meeting; we received **30 survey** responses.
- 77% of the respondents felt the Newsletter was Extremely Valuable (either a score of 4 or 5).
- 90% read their newsletter When it is Received or at least Quarterly (the majority, 80%, when received).
- Sections seen as Most Valuable are Calendar and Event Recaps (80%),
 Photos (67%), with Member Spotlights and Tech Tips (50%) seen as equally valuable.
- The respondents are slightly more willing to move to every Two Months or a
 Quarterly publishing cycle (53%).
- The respondents were overwhelmingly specific about Not Seeing Value in a printed/ mailed version (80%).

Our club uses the papelication to manage attendance at our events. Most of you are already familiar with the RSVP options for our events. Each time you click the check mark to RSVP, you are adding "1" to our count. If you and your co-pilot are attending an event, then you need to add 1 guest, that is if your co-pilot does not register themselves individually.

meetup

Some people have been complaining that Meetup sends them too many emails. There is a way for you to manage what you want the application to send to you. Here's how to do it:

- 1. To initiate the process, just click on your picture in the upper right hand corner of the screen (on a computer)
- 2. Then select "settings".
- 3. Under settings, you will see a selection on the left side bar "email updates". Clicking on the email updates will bring in a list of events that cause Meetup to send you an email.

- 4. Uncheck any of the listed boxes and that will stop Meetup from emailing you for each of those particular events.
 - Specifically, in the middle, there is **New Meetup Groups**, by unchecking that box, you will no longer get emails announcing a new meetup group that may have something to do with your "interests", indicators you selected when you signed up for the application.
- Once you have made your changes, you can go back to your photo and click on it to return to the Sahuaro MX5 Miata Club.

Test this out and see if your changes eliminate the number of unwanted emails.
