Long story short Mr Grey went from just a daily driver to a play toy also and the fever began.



Miata tips from a shade tree mechanic...

- 1. Upgrade your horn.
 - a. The stock horn on all Miatas is pretty pathetic. If the guy in the lifted pickup truck can't see you, do you really think he's going to pay any attention to that wimpy horn. I get mine on Amazon. I've used the Marco Automotive Tornado Horn several times with no issues. They're \$60. There are others that are much cheaper but I can't speak to their reliability.
 - b. Installation on a NA or NB (1990-2005) Miata is incredibly easy. The stock horn is mounted just

in front of the radiator on the passenger side. One bracket bolt holds it in place. Flatten the edges on one end of the bracket with a hammer and you can use it to attach the new air horn. Use the bolt on the bottom of the coolant overflow to mount the bracket and mount the new horn at the other end of the bracket. There's plenty of room. Connect the single wire from the old horn to the positive electrical tab on the new horn and run a wire from the negative tab on the horn to any nearby bolt that will serve as a ground connection.

- c. Be careful when you test the new horn. It is extremely loud and has that Italian sound to it. You can pretend you're driving a Ferrari now.
- d. Although I have owned NCs and NDs I have not attempted an install on them. You're on your own with that one.

What are fringe benefits? Is it normal for a woman to call me and ask for a date? When did





Here's the details....

Meet at the Chevron Station in Apache Junction, 75 E 29th Avenue, at 9:30am for a 10am departure. Head east on Highway 60 toward Gold Canyon and south on Highway 79 taking the back road toward Tucson, turning south on Highway 77 at Oracle Junction. Lunch at Bubb's Grub at 16010 N Oracle Rd, Catalina, AZ 85739-9113, north of Tucson. After lunch take Highway 77 south again into Tucson, west on Grant Drive, south on I-10 then merge onto I-19 south. Exit San Xavier Road to visit San Xavier del Bac Mission. A National Historic Landmark, San Xavier Mission was founded as a Catholic mission by Father Eusebio Kino in 1692. Construction of the current church began in 1783 and was completed in 1797.

The oldest intact European structure in Arizona, the church's interior is filled with marvelous original statuary and mural paintings. It is a place where visitors can truly step back in time and enter an authentic 18th Century space.

After the mission visit, we'll get back on I-19 and head to Green Valley for motel checkin. We're staying in Green Valley because there are simply no rooms available in Tubac during this event.

Friday night offers several options. Have dinner and a restful evening in Green Valley or head over to Tubac 18 miles to the south for the Luminarias festivities from 5 to 9pm. If you're having dinner in Green Valley I suggest Manuel's Mexican restaurant at 121 W Duval Road.
